The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
SECTION 1. G.S. 132-1.4A(h) reads as rewritten:	
"(h) Release of Recordings; Law Enforcement Purposes. – Notwithstanding the requirements of subsections (c), (f), and (g) of this section, a custodial law enforcement agency shall disclose or release a recording to a district attorney (i) for review of potential criminal charges, (ii) in order to comply with discovery requirements in a criminal prosecution, (iii) for use in criminal proceedings in district court, or (iv) any other law enforcement purpose, and may disclose or release a recording for any of the following purposes:

(11) For the city council to view a recording regulated pursuant to G.S. 132-1.4A." **SECTION 3.** This act applies to the City of Asheville only.

Permitted Purposes. – It is the policy of this State that closed sessions shall be held

Disclose a recording, in a closed session, to the city council. In advance of the

disclosure, council members shall execute a confidentiality statement agreeing to maintain the confidentiality of the recording prior to viewing the

recording. Recording images may be released publicly only upon court order."

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
