additional information required by the Department of Public Safety, and a form signed by the 1 2 applicant consenting to the check of the criminal record and to the use of the fingerprints and 3 other identifying information required by the State or national repositories. The applicant's 4 fingerprints shall be forwarded to the State Bureau of Investigation for a search of the State's 5 criminal history record file, and the State Bureau of Investigation shall forward a set of the 6 fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history check. The 7 Board shall keep all information pursuant to this subsection privileged, in accordance with 8 applicable State law and federal guidelines, and the information shall be confidential and shall 9 not be a public record under Chapter 132 of the General Statutes. 10 The Department of Public Safety may charge each applicant a fee for conducting the checks 11 of criminal history records authorized by this subsection. The Board shall require each applicant 12 to provide the Board with a criminal record report. All applicants shall obtain criminal record 13 reports from one or more reporting services designated by the Board to provide criminal record 14 reports. The Board shall keep all information obtained pursuant to this subsection privileged, in 15 accordance with applicable State law and federal guidelines, and the information shall be 16 confidential and shall not be a public record under Chapter 132 of the General Statutes. 17 Applicants are required to pay the designated reporting service for the cost of these reports." 18 SECTION 2. This act becomes effective January 1, 2018, and applies to

19 applications submitted on or after that date.
