General Assembly Of North Carolina 1 The Commissioner or a permitting authority may suspend or revoke the license (c) 2 issued under this Part of a permittee found guilty of (i) selling fireworks or explosives not 3 defined in Chapter 3 of Standard 87-1 of the American Pyrotechnics Association or (ii) selling 4 fireworks without a valid permit issued under this Part. In addition to or instead of suspending 5 or revoking the permit, the Commissioner or permitting authority may order the payment of a 6 civil penalty as set forth in subsection (d) of this section. 7 If the Commissioner or a local permitting authority orders the payment of a civil (d) 8 penalty pursuant to subsection (c) of this section, the penalty shall not be less than one 9 thousand dollars (\$1,000) nor more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000). In determining the 10 amount of the penalty, the Commissioner or local permitting authority shall consider the degree 11 and extent of harm caused by the violation, the amount of money that inured to the benefit of the violator as a result of the violation, whether the violation was committed willfully, and the 12 13 prior record of the violator in complying or failing to comply with laws, rules, or orders 14 applicable to the violator. The clear proceeds of the penalty shall be remitted to the Civil Penalty and Forfeiture Fund in accordance with G.S. 115C-457.2. Payment of the civil penalty 15 16 under this section shall be in addition to payment of any other penalty for a violation of the 17 criminal laws of this State. 18 § 58-82A-115. Prohibited activities. 19 The permitting authority, by majority vote, may suspend the permit of a person (a) 20 authorized to sell consumer fireworks or sparkling devices for engaging in any of the following 21 prohibited activities: 22 (1) Selling consumer fireworks or sparkling devices within the State without a 23 valid permit. Selling consumer fireworks or sparkling devices to a person who appears to 24 (2)25 be under the influence of alcohol or drugs. 26 <u>(3)</u> Knowingly aiding or assisting in procuring, furnishing, giving, selling, or 27 delivering consumer fireworks or sparkling devices to a person under the age of 18. | 11 | (c) Monthly Report. – The taxes levied by this Article are payable when a report is |
| 12 | required to be filed. A report is due on a monthly basis. A monthly report covers sales and other |
| 13 | activities occurring in a calendar month and is due within 20 days after the end of the month |
| 14 | covered by the report. A report shall be filed on a form provided by the Secretary and shall |
| 15 | contain the information required by the Secretary. |
| 16 | (d) Discount. – A person who is liable for the excise taxes imposed by this Article, who |
| 17 | files a timely report under this section, and who sends a timely payment may deduct from the |
| 18 | amount due with the report a discount of two percent (2%). This discount covers expenses |
| 19 | incurred in preparing the records and reports required by this Article. |
| 20 | (e) <u>Refund. – A person liable for the excise taxes imposed by this Article and in</u> |
| 21 | possession of unsalable consumer fireworks upon which the tax has been paid may return the |
| 22 | consumer fireworks to the manufacturer and apply to the Secretary for refund of the tax. The |
| 23 | application shall be in the form prescribed by the Secretary and shall be accompanied by a |
| 24 | written certificate signed under penalty of perjury or an affidavit from the manufacturer listing |
| 25 | the consumer fireworks returned to the manufacturer by the applicant. The Secretary shall |
| 26 | refund the tax paid, less the discount allowed, on the listed products. |
| 27 | (f) <u>Records. – Every person liable for the excise taxes imposed by this Article shall</u> |
| 28 | keep accurate records of the purchases, inventories, and sales of consumer fireworks. These |
| 29 | records shall be open at all times for inspection by the Secretary or an authorized representative |
| 30 | of the Secretary. |
| 31 | (g) Use. – The Secretary must credit the net proceeds of the tax collected under this |
| 32 | Article to the General Fund." |
| 33 | SECTION 6. This act becomes effective July 1, 2017, and Section 5 applies to the |

34 cost price paid for fireworks on or after that date.

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
