AN ACT TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF INSTRUCTION AT THE CONSTITUENT			
INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.			
The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article 1 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a			
new section to read:			
"§ 116-11.5. Duties regarding faculty teaching standards.			
(a) The Board of Governors shall adopt a policy, in accordance with this section,			
applicable to all constituent institutions except the North Carolina School of Science and Math and			
the University of North Carolina School of the Arts, that sets faculty teaching standards			
differentiated by the type of institution, according to Carnegie Classification institution types, and			
by course discipline, according to course discipline types defined by the American Academy of			
Arts and Sciences.

  - the place of State appropriations or any part thereof, but it is the intent of this section that those proceeds shall supplement the State appropriations to the end that the institution may improve and increase its functions, may enlarge its areas of service, and may become more useful to a greater number of people. However, the proceeds of an endowment fund may be used to supplement the salary of a professor whose salary has been reduced pursuant to G.S. 116-11.5."
  - **SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to academic years beginning on or after July 1, 2017.

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
